I am pleased to inform you that on June 6, 2024, the Committee on Accreditation, on behalf of the Commission on Teacher Credentialing, took action to remove the stipulations placed on San Francisco Unified School District. As a result of the above action, the Committee on Accreditation changed the accreditation status of San Francisco Unified School District from *Accreditation with Major Stipulations* to *Accreditation*.

Further, this letter serves as acknowledgement that the Commission on Teacher Credentialing has received your request to reclassify the following programs at San Francisco Unified School District from “approved-active” status to “approved-inactive” status effective September 1, 2024. The request was formally presented to and acknowledged by the Committee on Accreditation on June 6, 2024.
